I must admit that I’m not a historian, but I remembered a book by Lee Strobel, *The Case for Christ*, and to my excitement and surprise, Sadie agreed to dive into this book with me. The process is slow, and we are still building a friendship. However, as the weeks rolled by, Sadie started asking tough questions about Jesus and Christianity in general. Will she go to heaven if she waits until she meets Jesus to accept Him as her savior? Why do Christians do terrible things in the name of Jesus Christ? Why would God send anyone to hell if He loves everyone? These are just a few of the examples that have led to in depth conversations that we never thought possible!
